

# VOTE !

#### Two months ago

Two months ago, *Elections Pickering* (digital) was launched to positive reviews, support and acceptance not just by the candidates in the election but by many of the *BOOKz COOKz NOOKz* website visitors. Thank you everyone.

The goal in launching *Elections Pickering* was simple and clear: to increase voter turnout from the 18% of the previous election to 25%. A seemingly realistic goal. This goal is attainable but only with your participation. Vote !

Pickering has tried to make voting an even easier process with Internet voting. You can vote electronically, on your computer, on your smart phone, on your laptop...from the convenience of your kitchen, your family room, even your bathroom if you plan on making editorial comments. The turnout still depends on you. You need to take a few minutes to learn how to use the electronic access if you choose to vote that way. Otherwise, a week later, Oct 24th, you can still vote the old fashioned way. Walk, bike or drive over to your local polling station, check in with the polling clerks with your identification to confirm your identity and cast your ballot.

Some important preliminary steps to voting

- 1. Ensure you are eligible to vote
- 2. Bring suitable ID to the polling station (photo ID is best)
- 3. VOTE

To underline why you should vote again may be redundant. However, be reminded that municipal government affects your life more directly than any other level of government, from brushing your teeth and washing your face in the morning to your final visit to the washroom before bedtime at night. Your municipal government is there, so to speak.

#### The bottom line

**VOTE!** Vote because you care. Vote because you're a responsible citizen. Vote because you recognize that you really do have a say in how your municipal councillors manage your city. You're an important part of city government. Your vote is important.



There is currently farming on the **Federal Lands** in Ward 3. The original amount of expropriated land was the size of Ajax. Farmland is critical for our food supply. 319 acres of farmland disappear every day in Ontario. Some Pickering politicians are saying the Pickering land is airport lands. This is simply not true. There has never been a peer-reviewed study in the last 50 years to justify the many billions of dollars that would be wasted on an unnecessary airport. Experience and Trust I have a proven record of Experience and Trust. I was involved in Pickering politics, and supporting residents' concerns, long before I successfully ran as a candidate and was elected to Pickering Council and Durham Council.

Property Taxes are Simply Too High The biggest issue in Pickering is Property Taxes are simply too high! As a Regional Councillor, I continually voted against raising property taxes. I moved several motions each year to further reduce the budget expenditures, so that you would have more money in your pocket for your family's needs. Your property taxes should not keep increasing by more than your income, or more than the cost of living index.

Unlike most councillors, I was available full-time to serve and assist residents with all matters and concerns, as before, it will be my primary focus again.

Accountability and Transparency Some members of council have become too complacent. There should be **Term Limits**, as well as a **Recall** mechanism for removing Councillors, who say one thing to get elected, and then don't act in accordance with the demands of their residents. I will be bringing forward many positive motions in Council to hold our representatives accountable. We need to have **Recorded Votes** on all matters, so that you can know easily how your councillors voted on all matters. Councillor expenses should be much more readily visible.

Did you know that only about 30% of residents vote! Your Vote can make a huge difference, and is very important for protecting Pickering.
